

Nursery Admissions Policy

Plymouth Grove Primary School has a maximum capacity of 52 places for Nursery.

Plymouth Grove Primary School offers full-time education to all children invited to attend our Nursery.

However, in order to sustain this we require parents to check their eligibility for funding of 30 hours childcare to be paid to the school. Any eligible parents must apply for the funding and provide an eligibility code to the school in the requested format. Parents are also required to renew this code as and when notified by HMRC and the school.

No child will be excluded based on not being eligible for funding.

Children will become eligible for admission to our Nursery class from the September after the child has turned 3 years old.

Parents/Guardians can complete an application form for a nursery place as soon as the child is born.

The application form does not guarantee a place for your child.

Where the number of children seeking admission is within the set number of places, then every child shall be given a place.

Where the number of requests for admission exceeds the number of places, children will be admitted in the following order:

Category 1

Children who are looked after by a Local Authority and children who were previously looked after by a Local Authority. Children who were looked after or in state care

outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. Previously looked after children are children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangement order or special guardianship order). A child is regarded as having been in state care in a place outside of England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or another professional provider of care.

Children with exceptional medical/social needs providing the school can meet those needs.

Category 2

Children with a brother or sister attending the school from Reception to Year 6 when they take up their place.

Category 3

The distance between the child's permanent address and the school.

The school reserves the right to request evidence of the child's permanent address.
