

Y1 Weaving - Textiles

Key vocabulary:

Weaving: The action of forming a fabric or structure by interlacing threads or strands.

Warp: The thread which runs from **top to bottom** in a fabric.

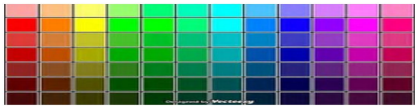
Weft: The thread which runs from **side to side** in a fabric.

Woven fabric: A textile formed by weaving. It has a warp and a weft.

Woven baskets: A basket is a stiff container that is used for carrying or storing objects. Baskets are made from thin strips of materials such as straw, plastic, or wire woven together.

Warm colours: Colours that remind you of the sun: red, yellow, orange.

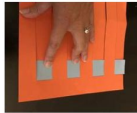
Cool colours: Colours that remind you of a winters day: blue, purple, dark green.



Paper weaving



Thread the paper weft: **under and over** through the warp.



Start the next row with an **alternative movement: over and under.**



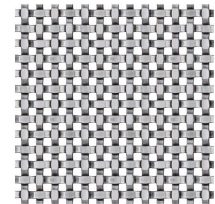
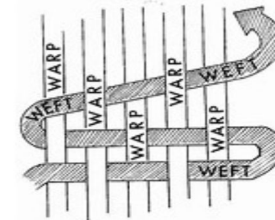
The finished weave has a pattern. **Can you describe it?**
