Sea: A large body of salt water.

Sand dunes: A hill of sand near the sea or in a desert.

Strandline: A line of washed-up seaweed or other debris once the tide has fallen.

Tide: The alternate rising and falling of the sea.

Man-made features: Features that have been created or constructed by humans such as roads, houses and harbours.

Natural features: Land or water features which are not man-made such as mountains, rivers, lakes and waterfalls.
